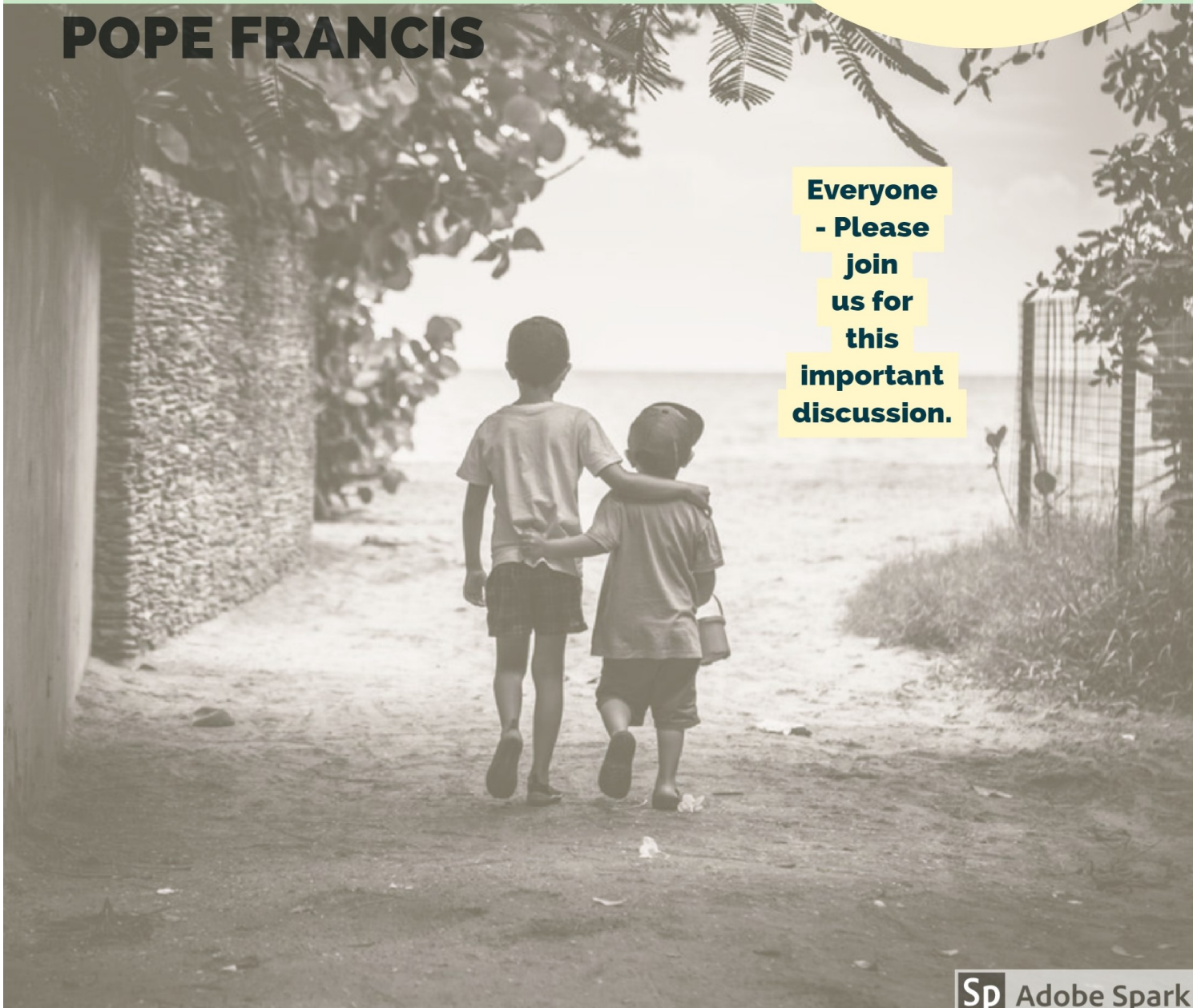

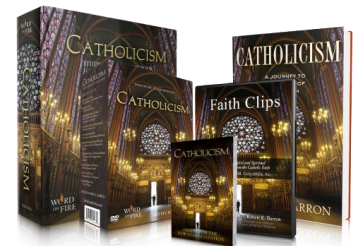
Wednesday Night Videos to Begin

On Friday, January 5, St. Mary's students were given the unique opportunity to learn about St. Teresa of Calcutta (Mother Teresa), and to learn about the ministry of a missionary. Sister Sefapano MC (Missionaries of Charity) talked with our students about her life in the order founded by St. Teresa. She met with the students in three groups—grades K-2, 3-5, and 6-8. Sister Sefapano attended St. Mary's School as a child, where she was known as Maribeth Riedeman. She shared with the students that her dream of being a missionary began in early elementary school. Under God's guidance, she felt her dream grow and she felt called to join Mother Teresa's order. Sister explained to the students the symbolism in the habit that the sisters wear, and explained their mission to serve the poor and suffering.

Sister Sefapano used her hand to demonstrate that the teachings of the Bible are always "at hand." Touching each finger on one hand, we can recite the words of Jesus—"You did it to me." She explained that this helps us to remember that whenever we help someone, we are helping Jesus. St. Teresa embodied this commitment to share Jesus' love to all those she met and served. She saw the face of Jesus in the faces of those who needed love and compassion.

Each student received a St. Teresa medal and prayer card as a reminder of our mission to serve others in the example of Mother Teresa.
