My dear people,

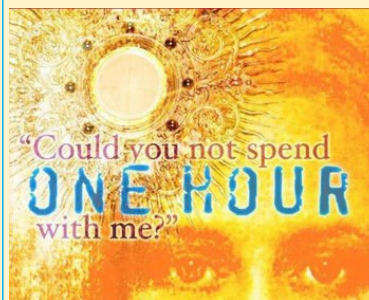
I would like to invite you to prepare for Lent this year on March 4 & 5 at 6:30 pm each evening with me and hopefully many of the Holy Land pilgrims.

ON THE PHYSICAL DEATH OF JESUS CHRIST

February 26, 2019

Jesus of Nazareth underwent Jewish and Roman trials, was flogged, and was sentenced to death by crucifixion. The scourging produced deep stripe-like lacerations and appreciable blood loss, and it probably set the stage for hypovolemic shock, as evidenced by the fact that Jesus was too weakened to carry the crossbar to Golgotha. At the site of crucifixion, his wrists were nailed to the patibulum (crossbar) and, after the patibulum was lifted onto the upright posts (stipes), his feet were nailed to the stipes. The major pathophysiologic effect of crucifixion was an interference with normal respirations. Accordingly, death resulted primarily from hypovolemic shock and exhaustion asphyxia. Jesus' death was ensured by the thrust of a soldier's spear into his side. Modern medical interpretation of the historical evidence indicates that Jesus was dead when taken down from the cross. *Journal of the American Medical Association.*

ATTENTION USHERS:

ASH WEDNESDAY SIGN UP SHEET IN USHER CLOSET

Arrive ½ hour before Mass

- *Lead usher should unlock ushers' closet and before 4:30 Mass place baskets near gift table
- *All ushers take positions at outside doors to open for parishioners. During winter, please stay between double set of doors.
- *Only open wooden doors for handicapped. This allows people to choose which door they enter and how much time they wish to talk in the gathering area.
- *By the time Mass begins, please be in your pew.
- *It is okay to sit with your family when ushering. If sitting one of the side sections, it is okay to move your collection basket to the bag of that section. Please leave the baskets behind the ushers' pew after collection. 10:00 return baskets to ushers closet after Mass.
- *If necessary, some (possibly two ushers) may help folks find seats especially at crowded Masses. If people wish to stay in gathering space, let them.

*The present collection method is working very well. At youth Masses and other occasions, gifts are brought forward by assigned families/persons. Your choice at other Masses.

*Please stay at bench or kneelers until the Communion Ministers get up to come forward; stand at 2nd or 3rd pew, allowing people to come forward easily.

*At the end of Communion procession, whoever is finished first is to give the message to the Communion Ministers on how many are in the back of their sections for Communion.

*After 4:30 and 8:00 Masses, place a handful of bulletins in the kiosks and the rest back in the closet; after 10:00 Mass place as many as will fit in the kiosks and the rest in the closet. Do not put bulletins on the gift table.

*Locking of the Church doors after 4:30 and 10:00 is working very well.

St. Mary's Prayer Shawl Ministry



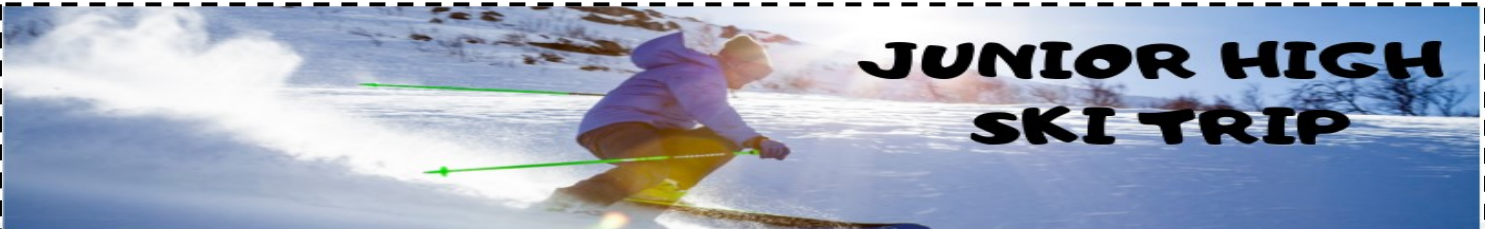
