

PALM SUNDAY

SUNDAY APRIL 14 This Sunday commemorates the beginning of the last days of Jesus' life. The palms we wave joyfully today are later burned. The ashes will be used next Lent to begin the season of penance. The Youth Choir's Passion Play will be at all Masses this weekend.

CHRISM MASS

TUESDAY APRIL 16 Will be held at the Cathedral in Indianapolis at 2:00 pm. During this Mass, holy oils are blessed by the bishop and are used during the year for anointing the sick, baptism and confirmation. Priest recommit their vows at this Mass. Everyone is welcome. People representing each parish in the diocese are present to receive the oils and take them back to their parish.

SEDER SUPPER

WEDNESDAY APRIL 17 Will take place in the St. Mary's Gym at 6:30 pm. Seder Super is also called the Passover Meal. This meal is what has evolved into our present Mass and is similar to the Last Supper Christ celebrated with his apostles. It is a celebration of God's leading the Jews from slavery in Egypt (the Exodus) and a time for fellowship.

The Triduum (Latin for "three days") our most holy days are:

Day 1: Holy Thursday, the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper - the beginning of is three-day celebration.

Day 2: Good Friday, celebration of the Lord's Passion/Veneration of the Cross.

Day 3: Holy Saturday, the night of nights. The primary celebration of the resurrection of the Lord.

HOLY THURSDAY

THURSDAY APRIL 18 Mass is celebrated ONLY AT 7:00 pm. This is the day of Evening Mass of the Last Supper. The emphasis of the Mass is upon Jesus' example to serve one another. Jesus calls us to be servants. Through the beautiful ceremony of the *Washing of the Feet*, we give witness to Christ's command to "love one another." This is the beginning of our Eucharist and of Priesthood. The oils that we received at the Chrism Mass are presented to the parish on this evening. The holy oils are placed near the baptistery (Oil of sick, Oil of Catechumen, Holy Chrism-baptism, confirmation, ordination). We will also be "Gathering Gifts of the Poor" by collecting large cans of fruit and vegetables for our Hot Meals Program. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will follow the 7:00 pm Mass until 11:00 pm. The Body of Christ will be carried in procession to a final place of exposition. You are invited to come and spend some quiet time with our Lord.

GOOD FRIDAY

FRIDAY APRIL 19 Services are at 3:00 pm. We gather quietly and listen to the reading of the Passion from the Gospel of St. John. We pray for all the world's needs. The cross is held up in our midst and we come forward for veneration. This is followed by Communion.

HOLY SATURDAY

SATURDAY APRIL 20 Night of all nights, the Easter Vigil begins at 8:00 pm. This first Mass of the Resurrection contrasts light and darkness, death and life. These ideas are made clearer by the New Fire, lighting of the Easter Candle, blessing of the baptismal water, and receiving into our faith those who have been taking instructions in the RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). This is the height of Holy Week and the climax of Lent.

A reception follows the service for the new Catholics. All are welcome. Holy Saturday Easter Vigil is an Easter Sunday Mass.

EASTER SUNDAY

SUNDAY APRIL 21 Masses will be celebrated at 7:00, 9:00, and 11:00 am in church. New life and fresh hope have come in the risen Christ. We celebrate with a renewal of baptismal promises to reject sin and evil, to love God and follow Jesus.

"This is the day the Lord has made. Let us be glad and rejoice. ALLELUIA."







St. Mary Cemetery Little Souls Burial Site Donation Requests



Jesus Holding Baby Statue—\$8,000.00 to \$10,000

This granite statue will be placed at the front of the Little Souls cemetery section. It will be a statue of Jesus hugging an infant. We chose a statue with a child to remind us of the Church teaching that our children go to heaven as human souls instead of the popular notion of angels. The picture is an example and not an exact replica.



Two Monuments—1 Donated. Need 1 More at \$2660.00

This is a 3.5-foot-high by 2-foot-wide granite monument upon which porcelain plaques will be affixed to memorialize babies who were lost through miscarriage but for whom there are no remains to bury. The plaques will have the names of the babies and parents along with the date of death. The monument will be engraved with the words "In Memory of Our Babies Whose Remains We Do Not Have"



Bench---\$2600.00

This will be a granite bench engraved with the words "Surrounding us are babies lost prior to 20 weeks gestation. God has them in His keeping. We hold them in our hearts." It will provide a place for visitors to sit and pray. The picture is an example and not an exact replica.



Granite 8"x8" Site Markers--\$15.00 Each (128 Needed)

To enable a more finished look, we are going to place all the markers for the burial site. When a burial occurs, the blank marker will be exchanged with an engraved marker (name, date of miscarriage, parents' names). The blank marker that is removed will then be engraved for the next burial. Any funds received when a burial occurs will be used to purchase more markers as the site is expanded. The picture is an example and not an exact replica.

Concrete—DONATED!

We will need about 4 cubic foot of concrete to create a foundation for the bench and two monuments. We will also need to pour concrete footers on which the individual markers will be placed.

Concrete Work—DONATED!

We need someone to please donate their time to lay the concrete.

Landscaping—DONATED!

We need a knowledgeable person to please donate their time to ensure that the trees and bushes surrounding the Little Souls site are planted correctly.

Trees and Bushes—Varying Costs

We are going to plant some low maintenance trees and bushes around the Little Souls site. The exact plants needed will be decided upon consultation with the landscaper.
