

Robots in School

Thanks to IN-MaC for a grant and SMAFA for their additional financial support, we now have 6 Dash & Dot robots in our classrooms! These robots help our students understand how computer programs work by learning their language, or computer code. Our Dash & Dot robots also help students to learn problem solving skills, encourage group collaboration, and improve math concepts. During lessons, students are given different challenges and have to work to create a program to make the robots successfully complete these challenges. It has been a very hands-on and engaging experience for grades 3-5.

Lent 2020 Week 3

Living Your Baptism in Lent

**“Do you reject Satan, the father
of sin and prince of darkness?”**

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, 238

Satan was created by God as an angel named Lucifer, or light-bearer. Lucifer became envious of God when the human beings God had created, were allowed to share in his eternal life. So Satan turned away from God and in Genesis convinces the man and woman in the story of creation, that their heavenly Father was not a God of love, but a God of deception. Every time we are drawn into the lies of the prince of darkness, we become ensnared and enslaved to sin and death.

Satan has no power over us because of Jesus Christ’s victory over death on the cross.

We are supplied with God’s grace to live in the light of our redemption from sin. Our Baptism in Christ claims us as God’s children, his own sons and daughters. Through Baptism we become holy people, anointed with individual gifts to proclaim God and reject Satan. By the witness of our own choices, others come to see how God’s Spirit is still present in the world.

In this Sunday’s Gospel from John, Jesus has a divine motivation why he “had to pass through Samaria” (4:4) Witness of the good news of Jesus to Samaritans was his reason for meeting at the well and telling the woman there that “whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst; the water I shall give will become for him a spring of water welling up to eternal life.”(4:14) This week we recommit to rejecting sin. We are invited to confess not just our errors but to profess profound faith in the God who desires to bring us to himself. “God is Spirit, and those who worship him must worship in Spirit and truth.”(4:24)

Praying through the week:

Professing our faith in God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit, am I aware of my need for God’s grace and mercy? Have I chosen God in my thoughts, words & actions?

Act of Contrition

*O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended You, and I detest all my sins because of Your just punishments, but most of all because they offend You, my God, who are all good and deserving of all my love.
I firmly resolve, with the help of Your grace to sin no more and to avoid the near occasion of sin.*

**End the day with a prayer of Thanksgiving for the days
blessings and for God’s presence.**
