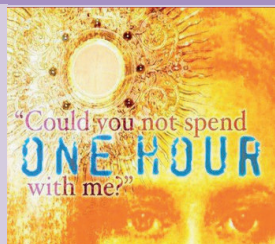
"Jesus said to her, 'Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?'" JOHN 11:40

Indiana's Catholic Bishops Suspend Public Sunday and Weekday Masses

In light of new information and recommendations from health officials concerning the danger of the COVID-19 pandemic and the urgency to stem the spread of the virus, the five Catholic bishops of Indiana have suspended effective March 18 and until further notice all public Sunday and weekday Masses throughout the Province of Indianapolis, which is comprised of the Archdiocese of Indianapolis and the Dioceses of Gary, Evansville, Fort Wayne-South Bend, and Lafayette.

In addition, St. Mary Parish in Greensburg, beginning on March 18, is also closing the Adoration Chapel, will not have Communion Service on Mondays, will not hold Stations of the Cross on Fridays in Lent, will not offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Saturdays. Weddings and funerals will have a limited number of attendees. Pastor, Fr. John Meyer will offer Masses privately for the good of the people, the Church, and for the intention of the day.

The archbishop and some of the priests on his staff will be making online Masses available soon. Please visit the homepage of the archdiocese, www.archindy.org, for more information.

During a time of prayer on Sunday or while viewing the Mass on T.V. or online, the faithful are encouraged to make an act of Spiritual Communion. This beautiful devotional practice in the Church is a real source of grace in communion with our Lord. Below is an example of a prayer for spiritual communion:

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

The faithful are also encouraged to prayerfully read the readings of Sacred Scripture for the day or to pray the rosary.

The Faith Formation Commission has continued to focus on our three key issues; the elderly, young adults, and marketing.

The FFC will be hosting a young adult social in February. This will be held after the 8am and 10am mass. This will be a time for young adults that are interested in joining the committee to come forward and bring ideas for idea boards.

There will be a luncheon held in March for identified seniors to be on the core group. There are a few different email programs that have been identified. The final decision needs made on which one to trial and to gauge its successfulness.

Living Your Baptism in Lent

"Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord who was born of the Virgin Mary, was crucified, died and was buried, rose from the dead, and is now seated

at the right hand of the Father?"

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, 239

"From womb to tomb." We hear this often said when referring to protecting life from conception to death. Life is precious and dying is but a new beginning. It is really a new birth, a passageway to eternal life. What we experience as grief and sorrow from the loss, sadness, and adjustments of being separated from the death of someone we knew and or loved, is painful, and should be evident that we are not meant for this world. In the Gospel for this Sunday from John, the story of Lazarus gives us plenty to ponder about from all the emotions and beliefs expressed by those who are confused and those who trust and hope in Jesus raising Lazarus back to life. Jesus' underlying purpose for this miracle was to reveal the glory of God and the glorification of the Son of God. "I am the resurrection and the life: whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" John 11:25-26

Jesus' death is central to our reflection on the sacrament of Baptism. Read Phil 2:5-11 and Luke 22:42 and know that Jesus' own death was in obedience to his Father's will. Jesus' incredible hope and trust in the Father's will, brought about his work of redemption for us. On the cross when

eLearning at St. Mary's

As we are all aware by now, the schools are closed in the State of Indiana until May 1. This means that the teachers and staff at St. Mary's have had to make some major adjustments to our lessons plans in order to teach our students remotely via eLearning. Fortunately, we had been working toward this goal already to be used for snow days so we were not starting from scratch. We just had to decide what those days would look like with such a long period of no contact with our students. Since all of this began while we were out for spring break, students do not have textbooks at home. The teachers have had to be creative in how they can teach the standards using the tools at hand. Luckily many teaching sites have offered free subscriptions to be used during this unprecedented time. That, coupled with the online resources we already use in our classrooms that students can access remotely, is making this time productive and effective.

We are using a 3-day model like many of the surrounding school corporations. Teachers send out the week's assignments on Monday and the students have tasks to complete for Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. Work is due on Friday morning for teachers to grade. Teachers are available via email to answer students' questions. Some of the work is online and some requires paper and pencil. Teachers can create teaching videos in order to present new lessons to students. We are blessed to have such dedicated teachers and the use of great technology to help our students through this difficult time. We are also thankful for the families that have had to help students with log-ins and assignments. We are all in this together and there is no school family more able to get through this!

In Matthew, chapter 4, at the very beginning, we hear about Jesus being isolated in the desert for 40 days. He was even tempted by the Devil to turn stones into bread, and though He was hungry, He refused to let the Devil win. I've been thinking a lot about Jesus being isolated for 40 days, and the similarities we may feel right now with that being separated from our friends at school, unable to go to events we have been planning and looking forward to, and missing the social component of our lives. Imagine being Jesus, in the middle of a dusty, hot desert with no food, without his followers, disciples, friends, and on top of that, being tested by the Devil. While also fighting the temptations from the actual Devil, I'm sure He fought the demons of anxiety and fear and depression while in the desert. We may be experiencing these same feelings of temptation, anxiety, fear, and depression. It's hard to go from having schedules that are jam packed to schedules that have essentially "ghosted" us in what feels like an instant.

My prayer for all of you today has been:

- * That you feel God always showing up in this time of quarantine.
- * That boredom becomes instead a gift of peaceful solitude.
- * That you may recognize opportunities to practice giving grace and mercy to those you may be quarantined with.
- * That you may grow closer to God through the time within your schedules that has now opened up.
- * That you may laugh, relax, REST, and renew what it is that makes you, YOU!
- * That you may seek multiple moments throughout the day to talk to God in prayer.

The Devil is tempting us right now- He is tempting us to be afraid, to be anxious, to be frustrated, to be filled with mental chaos with this virus and the social distancing it requires. I pray that we can see God in the midst of this and, just like Jesus in Matthew 4:11, we stand up to the Devil and say "Away from me, Satan! For it is written: 'Worship the Lord your God, and serve him only.'"

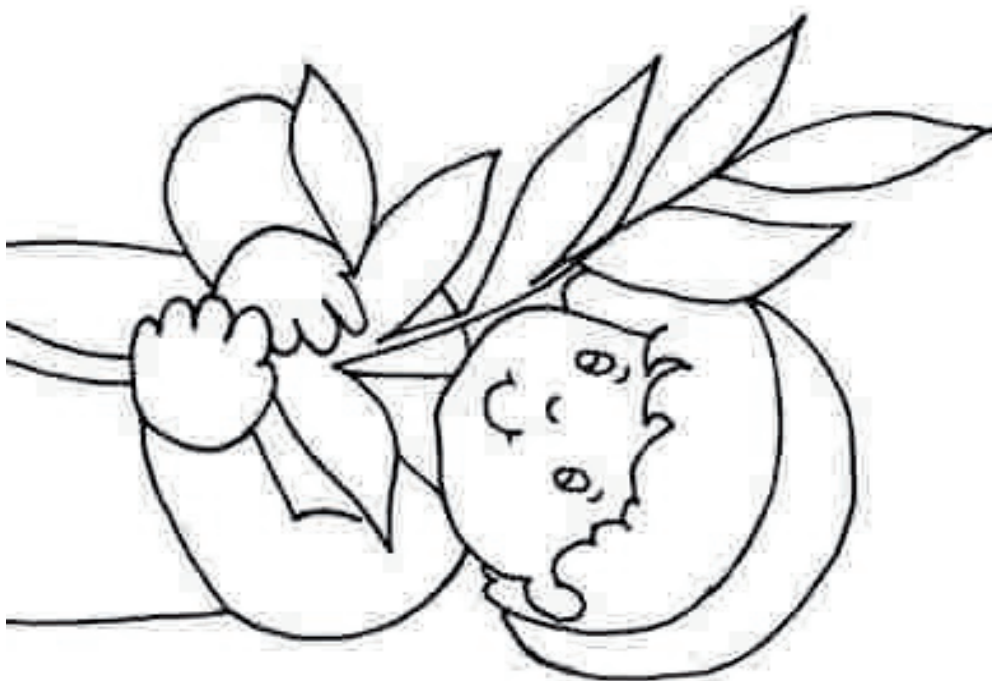
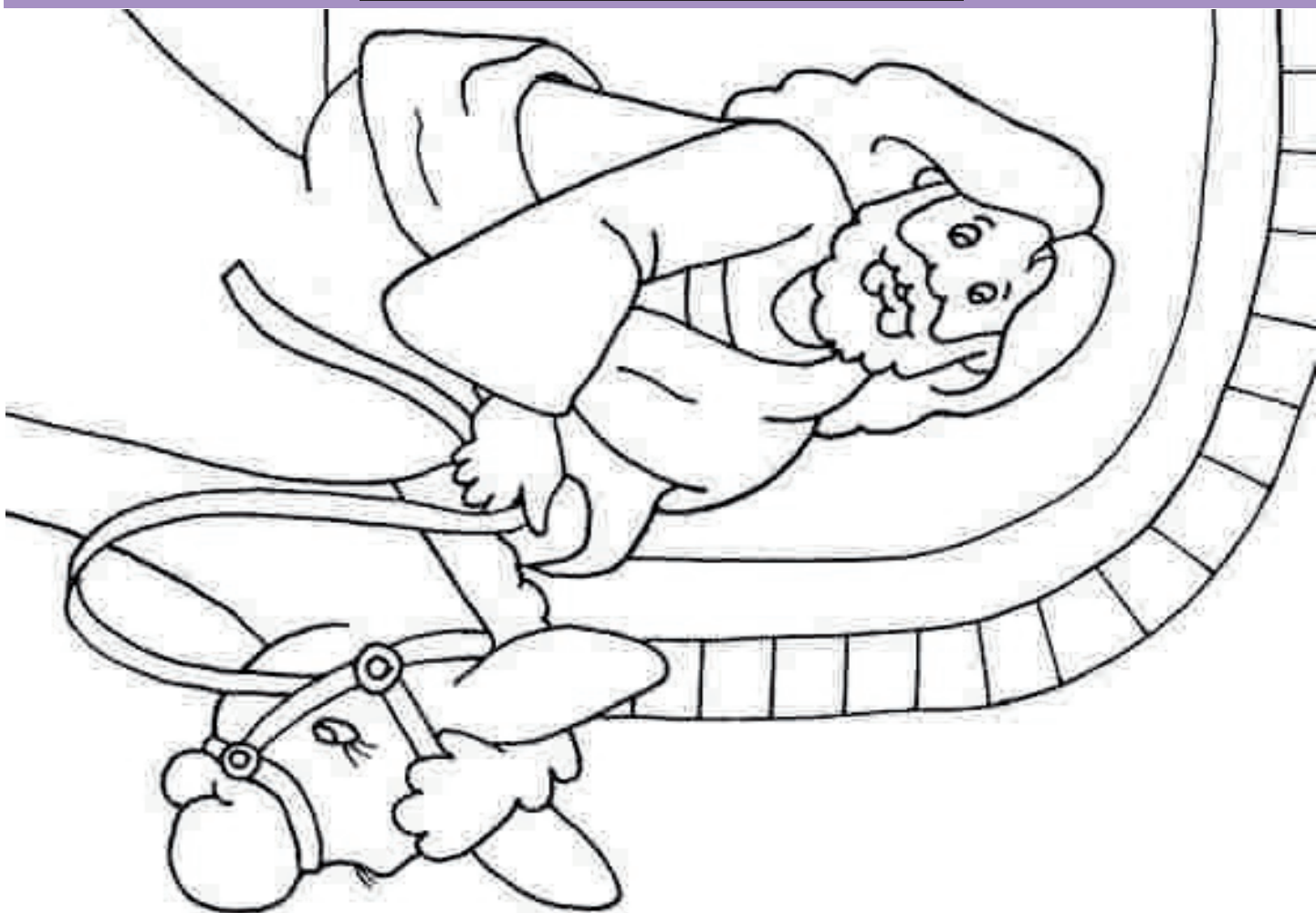
