Indiana's Catholic Bishops Suspend Public Sunday and Weekday Masses

In light of new information and recommendations from health officials concerning the danger of the COVID-19 pandemic and the urgency to stem the spread of the virus, the five Catholic bishops of Indiana have suspended effective March 18 and until further notice all public Sunday and weekday Masses throughout the Province of Indianapolis, which is comprised of the Archdiocese of Indianapolis and the Dioceses of Gary, Evansville, Fort Wayne-South Bend, and Lafayette.

In addition, St. Mary Parish in Greensburg, beginning on March 18, is also closing the Adoration Chapel, will not have Communion Service on Mondays, will not hold Stations of the Cross on Fridays in Lent, will not offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Saturdays. Weddings and funerals will have a limited number of attendees. Pastor, Fr. John Meyer will offer Masses privately for the good of the people, the Church, and for the intention of the day.

The archbishop and some of the priests on his staff will be making online Masses available soon. Please visit the homepage of the archdiocese, www.archindy.org, for more information.

During a time of prayer on Sunday or while viewing the Mass on T.V. or online, the faithful are encouraged to make an act of Spiritual Communion. This beautiful devotional practice in the Church is a real source of grace in communion with our Lord. Below is an example of a prayer for spiritual communion:

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

The faithful are also encouraged to prayerfully read the readings of Sacred Scripture for the day or to pray the rosary.

When we profess our beliefs in a fellowship of others, we are entering into the life of that group of people. What they say, do or profess to be true is what we choose to become also. In the case of becoming catholic in a community of same believers, we are proclaiming yes, we want to experience and show to others the joyful witness of Christ's love in communion with those of a unified faith. We are Baptized as Christians into the entire community of believers not just at our parish or in the Roman Catholic Church, but all who make up the Body of Christ-the Church-throughout the world and in heaven. The Body of Christ includes all who have been baptized in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

As baptized Christians, we believe that the Holy Spirit animates our life and our communion with those here on earth and those who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith; the Communion of Saints. We who renew our Baptismal promises renounce sin and all its deceptive lures. 

A WEEKLY LIVE YOUTH NIGHT

In Matthew, chapter 4, at the very beginning, we hear about Jesus being isolated in the desert for 40 days. He was even tempted by the Devil to turn stones into bread, and though He was hungry, He refused to let the Devil win. I've been thinking a lot about Jesus being isolated for 40 days, and the similarities we may feel right now with that being separated from our friends at school, unable to go to events we have been planning and looking forward too, and missing the social component of our lives. Imagine being Jesus, in the middle of a dusty, hot desert with no food, without his followers, disciples, friends, and on top of that, being tested by the Devil. While also fighting the temptations from the actual Devil, I'm sure He fought the demons of anxiety and fear and depression while in the desert. We may be experiencing these same feelings of temptation, anxiety, fear, and depression. It's hard to go from having schedules that are jam packed to schedules that have essentially "ghosted" us in what feels like an instant.

My prayer for all of you today has been:
