My Dear Parishioners:

The time has finally come. We are planning, with grave caution and with risk, to reopen for Sunday Mass on the Feast of Pentecost, the Birthday of the Church—May30th/31st. Of course, there will be restrictions with acceptable ways for us to celebrate the Eucharist together, yet still distanced, for some time.

I want to communicate with you what to expect when you are ready to return. First of all, I would like to remind you that the "obligation" to attend Mass, as designated by the archbishop and shared by the bishops of Indiana, does not resume until August 15. And, those of 65 years of age and older, and those with underlying health issues at any age, are highly encouraged <u>not</u> to attend Mass or any church related gathering--hopefully only through June. I beg you to follow this directive and so continue to watch or listen at home.

Continuing to participate in Mass remotely is the recommended and healthiest practice for all. St. Mary parish can help slow the spread of the coronavirus and live out the Gospel of loving our neighbor by praying at home. It is risky for us to gather in large numbers and we wish to model what a healthy environment can be in order to pray again in public. Remember, anyone can carry the coronavirus, not show symptoms and pass it on especially to seniors and vulnerable persons. Our local Board of Health offers support and will check in from time to time. If our practices do not contribute to a safe environment, and the virus spreads, we will do the responsible and Christian thing and close again.

If you are in a safe place to return to St. Mary on Pentecost, May 30, 31, here is what you should expect: (I will attempt to keep Mass close to one half hour.)

• You will find the church pews marked in a way that will enable the recommended physical distancing standards—6' apart, except for same household members. Consequently, there will be room in church for approximately 275 persons for each of our three Masses. If you must stand for lack of space, do so in the ambulatory* with appropriate distancing. If church is "crowded" when you enter, it will be in your

- best interest to return home and pray in private. There will be no gathering or standing in the Gathering Space.
- The church building will not be opened until ½ hour before each Mass. Do not enter church until after 4pm, 7:30am or 9:30am. Time between Masses is necessary for cleaning.
- The gathering space will be set up in such a way as to encourage physical distancing as well as allowing for entering and exiting safely and quickly. When entering church, outside doors will be opened for you, or propped open. Ushers will be masked. Those of the same household may sit together; others are to leave at least 6' between you. Shorter pews may accommodate only 1 or 2 people. Longer pews could hold up to 4 with 6' physical distancing.
- If you forget to bring your face covering, disposable masks will be readily available for you to wear and handmade ones that you can take home, wash, and wear the following week will also be available. This requirement will involve wearing our masks except as we take Communion.
- Available small bottles of hand sanitizer will be given to those who
 forgot to bring their own. You are asked to sanitize before coming to
 Communion and as desired.
- There will be no singing for a few weeks but music will be played at appropriate times. Hymnals will be in storage.
- Collection baskets will be at entrances. In order to operate our parish, we need you to continue to make your offertory gift either by Sunday collection, the U.S. Postal Service, or online giving using our parish website. Thanks to all who have been able to make your sacrificial gift!
- Bulletins will be available but maybe not immediately. (It is always
 accessible on our parish website.) They will be on stands and at kiosks.
- You are highly encouraged to receive Holy Communion in the hand. Please extend arms fully and cup hands when receiving. Communion Ministers will, of course, sanitize their hands before they distribute and when finished, and will be wearing face covering. (I will not be distributing Holy Communion. I continue to have seasonal sinus issues and I turn 65 soon! Yippie!)
- After Communion, you will exit the church through the closest doors, rather than return to your pews. (The emergency exit to the east, while usable during this time, has steps.)

- Those coming forward but not able to receive Communion, both children and adults, will not be blessed out loud or by touching.
- Communion will only be distributed at the front of church and by the east emergency exit.
- Holy Communion to the homebound is not allowed at this time. Do not bring Pyx containers to church.
- The pews and all touchable surfaces will be sanitized after each Mass.
- Through June, at least, we will not have altar servers and all of other Liturgical Ministers will be under the age of 65.
- Only the single family restroom will be open through June.
- Doors will be unlocked as needed. Handicap/Key fob entrance will remain deactivated through June.
- There will be no childcare available during the 10:00 Sunday Mass through August.
- Remember to take your temperature at home if you have the slightest concern about a fever and coming to church.
- Do not use cologne, perfume or other scents as these can initiate a cough in many people (like myself) and coughs, especially at this time, cause alarming reactions.

Church will be open for private prayer Tuesdays only, beginning May 19, standing or walking in the ambulatory* and shrine areas, or sitting only in marked pews at the end of the Main aisle. I will be available to hear confessions, weather permitting, at the front porch of the rectory that day, from 10:00 to Noon and in the reconciliation chapel from 1:00 to 3:00. No Confessions will be scheduled on Saturday through June. Our first public Mass will be celebrated at 5:30, May 19. Please sit in marked pews, at ends of main aisles. Don't forget your masks and hand sanitizer.

- The Adoration Chapel will remain closed through June.
- Funerals in church will resume June 1st.
- Baptisms will be scheduled through the parish office after June 1st and only celebrated outside of Mass, until further notice.
- Dates are to be determined for the celebration of 1st Communions and the Reception into the Church of our RCIA candidates.
- Confirmation is yet to be determined by Archbishop Thompson.
- Sunday Hot Meals may resume after the 4th of July.
- Parish meetings will continue off campus and remotely through June.

- When you make appointments to meet with us, we will try to use Tuesday's over the next several weeks as church doors will be open as well.
- Individual and communal memorial Masses may now be scheduled
 after June 1st for those whom we've buried without the
 full celebration of their lives, for those families who would like to do
 so. I plan to offer the opportunity for special communal memorial
 Masses in November, the month of All Souls.
- Funeral Meals will resume after August 1.

You may continue to "attend" Mass on our parish website, through our Facebook site, and on YouTube after 7pm Saturdays or listen on WRBI Sundays at 10:00am. Sponsors would be appreciated in order to continue broadcasting on 103.9 WRBI.

Our parish and school staff and I remain reachable through the regular phone numbers and extensions. I can administer the emergency anointing of the sick only in non-Covid 19 cases. Specified younger priests are designated for these cases and I'll reach out them if necessary.

St. Mary school questions or concerns can be answered through the school office.

Only time will tell when we might get back a little closer to normal. This is painfully difficult for all of us from our young to old and in between! One day, all of us will gather with celebrations of joy in which we won't be able to contain ourselves! I can't wait! But I must wait! Please wait and pray with me as we carry out our sacramental and spiritual lives as safely as we can.



Thoughts On Parenting

These are unprecedented times. Stayat-home restrictions, social distancing, home learning, drive-by birthdays, cancelled proms and graduations are just a few of the daily routines to which families have become accustomed. For parents, it is a new territory of disrupted routines, but also an opportunity to reflect on the gift of being a parent.

Parent - one who brings up and cares for another. The definition, according to Webster's Dictionary, seems very short when one tries to encompass the entire role one has as a parent, and with it the never-ending worry that maybe we aren't doing enough or the

constant thorn that one could be a better parent. There isn't in existence a barometer or tool that measures one as a parent, but in Proverbs 22:6 we are reminded to train up a child in the way he/she should go, and when she/he is old he/she will not depart from it. The greatest love of all is that Christ himself has allowed each of us to be a parent; in some form, to those that are younger either by blood and genetics or simply as someone that is able to share God's love.

With the reminder that our time here on this Earth is short, it's important to remember the words that Jesus left the disciples: "I will not leave you orphans; another Advocate will be with you." This is known as the Holy Spirit and as parents of the world we understand that in leaning into the Spirit we are reminded that the Father and Son is in us; therefore if and when we depart from our children, the act of sharing our love and joy of Christ in the practice of our faith during our time with them will remain a reminder that even we will be with the children we've raised and loved while here and when we are gone.

Our daily practice of our faith as parents is crucial to not only us as individuals but to those who may bear






Therefore in our absence our children will know that they are not alone, they will realize that even in not seeing their parents, they will always live in them. 


