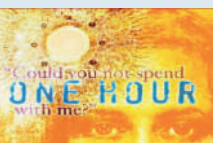

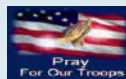

RESPECT LIFE MONTH

October 2020

Jesus uses the parable of the Good Samaritan to answer a question that is both searing and simple: *"Who is my neighbor?"* (Luke 10:29). Our familiarity with this parable makes it easy for us now to identify as "neighbor" those on the margins of our society such as those experiencing homelessness or poverty. But how often do we see our neighbor in the person who disagrees with us? As Catholics, our strong tradition of social teaching compels us to be actively engaged in the building up of our communities. This is achieved by being involved in the political process-and yet today, many shy away from such involvement because our national and local conversations are filled with vitriol and harsh languages, often directed at people themselves. When personal attacks replace honest debates, no one wins. This kind of attack, no matter the reason, only serves to further divide our communities. What is needed is good, honest, civil dialogue. This means that we must treat everyone as worthy of being at the table, worthy of our respect, and worthy of being heard. *In short, it means treating everyone as our neighbor.*

During Respect Life month we will designate different groups each weekend. We will be helping by donating items for their use, such as, cash or gift cards for our Sister Parish, baby items, items for our senior groups (Nursing Homes, etc.).

Week two: Our Sister Parish in Tohatchi, New Mexico (cash or gift cards from Walgreens, Target, Walmart, Family Dollar, or Big Lots)

Week Three: Card shower and items for all residents in Nursing Homes. Cards will be provided in the Gathering Area in Church

Week Four: Baby Items

We have received correspondence from our Sister parish, St. Mary's in Tohatchi, New Mexico. As the pandemic we all are experiencing, so, has it affected the Navajo reservation and the missions of St. Mary, St. Anthony, and St. Joseph. Fr. Dale Jamison, OFM, the pastor and Sr. Marlene Kochert, OSF, along with a very small group of personnel are desperately attempting to keep the mission churches and school operating and offering assistance to the people on the reservation.

They have enlisted the help of another Food pantry to help with providing the people with the day to day staples. The volunteer groups that visit the reservation each year, as they have in the past, have not been permitted to come because of the pandemic. The mission churches on the Reservation – **St. Mary, Tohatchi – St. Joseph, Coyote Canyon – St. Anthony, Naschitti** are their hope for assistance.

This year as part of our Respect Life celebration, Fr. John is requesting we send them our prayers and whatever help we can through a weekend collection. We are "brothers and sisters" in Christ and through our prayers and assistance we can be a part of our Navajo family sharing their trials and hardship at this time. Thank you for whatever help you can give.

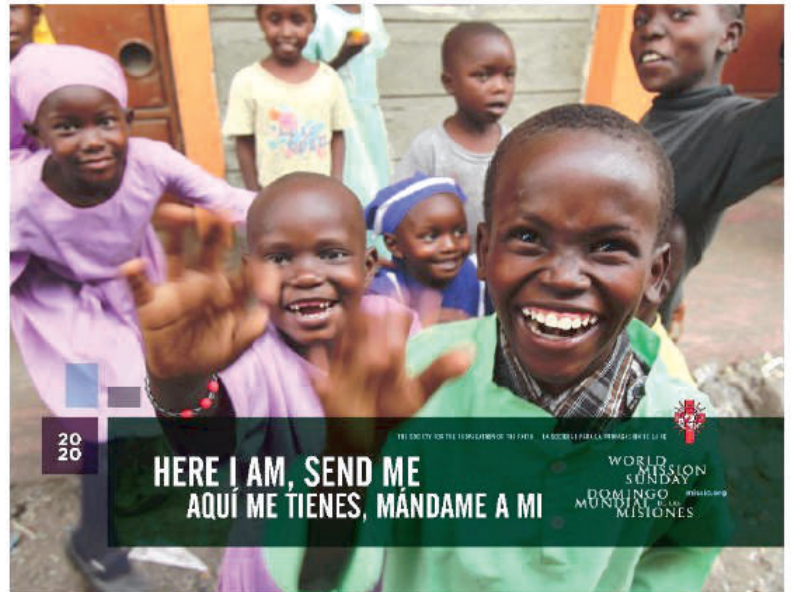
World Mission Sunday is Next Week!

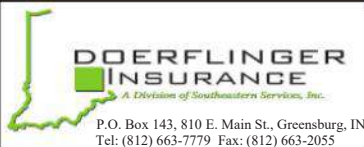
