



### Walk-a-thon Update

On Friday April 22, our second annual St. Mary's Walk-athon took place on the Travis Trail. Students in Pre K through the eighth grade had a scheduled time to walk some laps and earn some money for our school. It turned out to be beautiful weather – thank you, Jesus!

Our top pledge-earning student was Braylon Brancamp who brought in \$750 in donations! He was rewarded with two tickets to King's Island for his efforts. Mrs. Mauer's class was the top earning class so they will be treated to a pinata filled with goodies in the shape of a pineapple.

The top two students in each classroom were entered into a drawing to win a St. Mary's picnic blanket or a St. Mary's camp chair. These are the lucky winners: Nora McCamment, Chris Leon, Ronald Elliott, Eric Witkemper, Payton Koors, and Nolan McCamment.

The students earned prizes for just turning in donations. For a \$5 donation, students could chose a homework pass or a set of colored pens. 166 students chose the homework pass to get out of an assignment. And 146 chose the pens. Students who collected a ten-dollar donation earned a St. Mary's walk-athon t-shirt; 312 students reached that mark. There were prizes at the \$25, \$50, and \$100 levels as well. Many students took home a bagful of prizes for the donations they brought in.

With all of the great participation, we were able to reach the \$17,000 mark to earn a movie day. On May 24, the St. Mary's Cinema will be open and students will enjoy a movie of their choice. We also surpassed the \$22,000 mark which earned students a free afternoon on Tuesday, May 17.

The walk-a-thon was a huge success thanks to a great effort by our students and the wonderful generosity of our families and the community. We would like to thank everyone who donated to this cause. We are blessed to have you!


Hello! Please read this preliminary information about a special event on Sunday, June 19th. More details to follow.
