THE MOST HOLY

OF CHRIST

Historically known by its Latin name, **Corpus Christi**, celebrates the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist - Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. It is traditionally celebrated on the Thursday following the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity. The feast dates to the Middle Ages and originated with a visionary nun and a Eucharistic miracle. Pope Urban instituted Corpus Christi for the Universal Church and celebrated it for the first time in Orvieto in 1264, a year after the Eucharistic Miracle in Bolsena.

Reflection: "Gathering As One"

This month, we observed many feasts, including the one that celebrates our gathering together around the table to be fed by the Lord. Breaking the bread, sharing the cup----we are commanded: "Do this in remembrance of me" this was the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi).

Our liturgical table reminds us that we are to open our doors, our homes and our lives and to gather around our tables with others in the family of God----no matter who they are, what they believe, what they look like, what faith they profess. Whatever the differences in the diversity around us, we are compelled by the Gospel to break bread together, heal our divisions, offer peace.

If we can do this work, this mission of gathering around the table, sharing what we have, loving as God loves, becoming one with God—then we know the promise: We will have life and have it in abundance. (CelebrationPublications –L/SCommission)
