

Fire Prevention Week

The first week of October is nationally recognized as Fire Prevention Week and our local fire fighters go all out to increase safety and awareness. They visit all area elementary schools to talk with the students about important fire safety topics. At St. Mary's, students in grades K-2 had a pair of firemen visit each classroom. Veteran Brian Wenning brought along one of the newer recruits, Ethan, to demonstrate how a fire fighter puts on his gear and then let the kids see and hear what Ethan sounded like in his mask in hopes of making them less likely to be afraid if a fire fighter ever has to rescue them. They reviewed topics such as crawl low under smoke and "Stop, Drop, and Roll" if your clothes are on fire and the importance of having a safe meeting place for your family in the event of a fire evacuation. Our students in grades 3-5 got to see a fire truck up close and learn about the gear that it carries. They also went over those important fire safety topics to be sure they were ready in case they ever experience a fire. We are very fortunate to have such a wonderful group of local fire fighters who are willing to spend time in our school. The students LOVED their visit and were even more excited when they saw the fire fighters in the cafeteria to join them for lunch and more conversations! A big thank you to GFD!



Daniel Markham is the author of 52 Masses, which chronicles his 2021-22 trip to all 50 states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico to experience Catholicism in America.

At each parish he visited, Daniel wrote about someone or something taking place there – a ministry, an effort at evangelization, an individual's story, etc. He attended Mass in parishes of all sizes, in rural, urban and suburban settings and a few places that weren't parishes at all.

The idea was to explore the many ways Catholics are living the faith in the United States. His book was published at the end of 2022.

Daniel is a former resident of Greensburg and parishioner at St. Mary's, where all three of his now -adult children were baptized. He and his wife Kemberly, a Catholic school principal, reside just outside Cincinnati. They attend St. John the Evangelist, where he belongs to the Knights of Columbus and serves in the Society of St. Vincent de Paul.


