

Red Ribbon Week

Friday we celebrated Twin Day, asking students to dress like a classmate of their choosing. This was in keeping with the idea that "My brain and healthy choices make a good pair." We reminded students that using drugs and alcohol has an adverse effect on the brain.

Also, on Friday we welcomed Nathan Harmon of Your Life Speaks. He met with different grade levels individually so that he could tailor his talk to be appropriate for each audience. The Greensburg Prevention Group helped us fund this convocation so that our students could hear his important message about how their choices really have a big impact on the lives of others.


Did you know?

Daniel Markham is the author of 52 Masses, which chronicles his 2021-22 trip to all 50 states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico to experience Catholicism in America.

The idea was to explore the many ways Catholics are living the faith in the United States. His book was published at the end of 2022.

He and his wife Kemberly, a Catholic school principal, reside just outside Cincinnati. They attend St. John the Evangelist, where he belongs to the Knights of Columbus and serves in the Society of St. Vincent de Paul.




