

HOLY OILS—The Church makes use of three holy oils: **the oil of the sick, the oil of the catechumens and the holy chrism oil**. The first two are blessed, and the bishop consecrates the third, ordinarily during the annual Chrism Mass. Each has a distinctive purpose in the Church.



Oil of the Sick

The oil of the sick, pure olive oil, is used for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. This sacrament can be administered any time and in any place. The priest lays hands on the sick or elderly person, says special prayers and anoints the person by placing oil in the form of a cross on the forehead and hands. Through this sacrament, God gives the sick person grace and strength to bear the illness or infirmity. In addition, many Catholics have witnessed

the power of this anointing to bring spiritual, emotional and even physical healing.

Oil of the Catechumens

Both adults and infants prior to baptism are anointed with the oil of the catechumens, pure olive oil. This rite most often takes place during Mass, prior to holy Communion. The priest or deacon anoints the catechumens. He prays that God will instill them with wisdom for discernment and with the strength necessary to avoid evil during their inquiry into the Catholic faith and their preparation for a life with Christ. Similarly, an infant is anointed just before receiving the waters of baptism. This anointing is to help the child ward off evil, avoid temptation and possess the faith necessary to carry the cross of Christ throughout life.

Holy Chrism Oil

The third oil, holy chrism oil, is olive oil mixed with balsam. The oil symbolizes strength, and the fragrant balsam represents the "aroma of Christ" (2 Cor 2:15). Anointing with chrism oil signifies the gift of the Holy Spirit. It is used to consecrate someone or something to God's service.

We witness the use of the holy chrism when young people are confirmed, and at the Easter Vigil when adults are confirmed. Chrism oil is also part of the baptismal rite. Following an infant's baptism with water and before he receives the white garment, the cross with chrism oil is traced on the crown of the child's head, marking him as a Christian. Holy chrism oil is used as well during the ordination of a priest (the Sacrament of Holy Orders) and the consecration of a bishop. It is the anointing used in the consecration of a church and the blessing of an altar and the vessels used at Mass.

PALM SUNDAY

SUNDAY March 24 This Sunday commemorates the beginning of the last days of Jesus' life. The palms we wave joyfully today are later burned. The ashes will be used next Lent to begin the season of penance. Youth Choir's Passion Play will be part of our Palm Sunday celebration once again

CHRISM MASS

TUESDAY
March 26

Will be held at the Cathedral in Indianapolis at 2:00 pm. During this Mass, holy oils are blessed by the bishop and are used during the year for anointing the sick, baptism and confirmation. Priest recommit their vows at this Mass. People representing each parish in the diocese are present to receive the oils and take them back to their parish. There will be no 5:30 pm Mass here.

SEDER SUPPER

WEDNESDA

Will be at the St. Mary's Gym at 6:30 pm. Seder Supper (also called the Passover Meal) is what evolved into our present Mass and is similar to the Last Supper that Christ celebrated with his apostles. It is a celebration of God leading the Jews from slavery in Egypt (the Exodus) and a time for fellowship. (RSVP at tkramer@stmarysgreensburg or 663-8427 ext 200.)

The Triduum (Latin for "three days") our most holy days are:

Day 1: Holy Thursday, the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supperthe beginning of this three-day celebration.

Day 2: Good Friday, celebration of the Lord's Passion
Day 3: Holy Saturday, the night of nights. The primary
celebration of the resurrection of the Lord.

HOLY THURSDAY

THURSDA

Mass is celebrated ONLY AT 7:00 pm. This is the day of Evening Mass of the Last Supper. The emphasis of the Mass is upon Jesus' example to serve one another. Jesus calls us to be servants. This is the beginning of our Eucharist and of Priesthood. The oils that we received at the Chrism Mass are placed near the baptistery (Oil of sick, Oil of Catechumen, Holy Chrism-baptism, Confirmation, Ordination).

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will follow the 7:00 pm Mass until 11:00 pm. The Body of Christ will be placed in a tabernacle in the large assembly. You are invited to come

GOOD FRIDAY

March 29

Service is at 3:00 pm. We gather quietly and listen to the reading of the Passion from the Gospel of St. John. We pray for all the world's needs. Veneration of the Cross will be followed by our Communion procession.

HOLY SATURDAY

SATURDAY


Night of all nights, the Easter Vigil begins at 8:00 pm. This first Mass of the Resurrection contrasts light and darkness, death and life. Highlights of this evening are the lighting of Easter Candle, blessing of the baptismal water, and receiving into our faith those who have been taking instructions in the RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). This is the height of Holy Week and the climax of Lent. **Holy Saturday Easter Vigil is an Easter Sunday Mass.**

Masses will be celebrated at 7:00, 9:00, and 11:00 am in church. New life and fresh hope have come in the risen Christ. We celebrate with a renewal of baptismal promises to reject sin and evil, to love God and follow Jesus.






