



Awards Day 2024-part 4

We used this opportunity to recognize some winners from the STEAM Showcase that the middle school students were involved in earlier in the spring. Each middle school student chose a STEAMthemed project to present at the showcase – something that has to do with science, technology, engineering, arts or math. The sixth graders were asked to choose something in one of these areas that they wanted to learn about, not had to learn about, and to present what they discovered on the topic. Seventh graders tried their hand at designing a set of house plans and then found the cost to build, furnish and insure the house. And the eighth grade class was challenged to find a project that would make an impact in our community. ADOPT-A-VILLAGE HEARTS FOR HONDURAS FOOD FOR THE POOR

As I have gotten older, I realize how lucky and blessed I have been in my life. I grew up in a loving family, safe and secure, never hungry. Even in harder times of my life, I had a place to live and a way to support and feed my family and keep them safe. Much of the world does not live that way. They don't have a house of their own, a job to go to, food to feed their children. Poor in a 3rd world country like Honduras is a whole different level of poor compared to the US. There is no government housing, health care or food benefits to fall back on —ever. People including children die from lack of very basic healthcare and food every day. Parents can't keep their children safe from hunger, violence, trafficking—can't even get simple infections treated or feed them enough to nourish their brains and body adequately.

St Mary's is joining with Food for the Poor to establish a new village in Honduras at a place called Cucuyagua. It's a beautiful place in many ways but a very hard life for the poor there. Over 50% of the population of Honduras live in severe poverty. They are the working poor scrambling to make a living-trying to keep their families alive but their futures are bleak unless someone helps them out of that. The Adopt a Village program is the way we can be that someone. There are 50 homes planned with a school and community center. Each family will work with Food for the Poor to develop a skill or trade to be able to support themselves and their family- empowering them long term. The families will have a future-not just grinding poverty generation after generation.

The Adopt a Village program is a solid achievable plan for giving them that future. St Mary's has committed to raising 1 million dollars for this village. We are over halfway there -I am confident it can be done. We propose a program that brings families here at St Mary's together to fund a house for a poor family in Honduras in memory or in honor of a loved one. The house will be dedicated in their name. Each house actually costs approximately \$10,000- we are asking families to raise at least half that-\$5,000 per house. An extended family can work together to raise the money. The Adopt a Village committee can help develop individual plans for family groups to raise the money.

One of the families we visited that has stuck with me the most was a tiny little mother named Gladys with 2 daughters age 5 and 6. The work that she has found to feed and care for them was selling small snacks in a small cement building and charging a small fee to use the bathroom. As part of that she has to leave the 2 little girls there by themselves to sell and clean the bathroom after people use it-while she goes to the bus station to bring customers to her spot. These little girls are alone- a few feet away from a busy street- and at the mercy of anyone that might come by if that person wanted to injure them, kidnap them, steal from them. If the mother doesn't go to the station to find customers there is not enough money to feed them. I can't think of the fear she has every day she has to walk away from them- praying they are there when she comes back. That's the family I want my family to dedicate a house for. But there are so many other families with their hard stories too that are waiting to be helped. Please join our program with your family to help them out of poverty






