Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross Bearing Our Crosses With Joy

We may have any number of crosses throughout our lives. Some may be small, some may be big. Some may be heavy, some may be light. Some may be temporary, some may be long lasting. As Christians, we are called to bear those burdens, not begrudgingly but joyfully. Sometimes that seems downright impossible. How can I have joy in my life when every moment is filled with pain (whether that be physical or emotional)?

The answer is, it is not possible without a profound relationship with our Lord, that includes constant surrender to His will. In His great love for us, He often allows things to happen that we don't understand, but are for our good or for the good of others. After all, the goal for each of us is eternal salvation, not earthly comfort. But whether we suffer rejection, loneliness, illness, pain, hunger, cold, or even torture and death, we know that He has experienced it all and knows exactly how it feels. We can ask Him to walk with us each step of the way and be our strength when our own fails. We may get to the point where we are able to rejoice in our sufferings like St. Paul, or endure them without complaint or remember to offer them up. But above all, may our crosses be a constant reminder to us of today's powerful Gospel passage: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life" (John 3:16). The Exaltation of the Holy Cross (September 14) Treasures from Our Tradition




On this date in 335 two churches and a shrine erected by Constantine over the empty grave of Jesus and over the place of the crucifixion were dedicated. After these were destroyed by the Persians in 614, the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, which still stands, was erected by the Crusaders in 1149. Today also commemorates the event that led to the building of the churches dedicated in 335: the discovery of the "true cross" by St. Helena, Constantine's mother, in 326. According to one legend, St. Helena traveled to Jerusalem on pilgrimage, in search of the true cross. Workers she hired dug through a pagan temple that had been erected on the site of the Crucifixion by Hadrian and found three crosses. A dying woman was brought in, and touched by each cross in succession, the last of which healed her. Helena ordered that this cross be divided in three parts, one to be kept in Jerusalem and the other two to be sent to Constantinople and Rome. The pieces in Jerusalem and Constantinople were ultimately lost. Slivers were taken from the portion that went to Rome until eventually it was scattered around the world.

Of course, the significance of the true cross lies not in the wood itself but in the burden that it bore. As a faithful Christian, what crosses do you accept in your life today?

Saint Hildegard of Bingen

Feast Day: September 17

Saint Hildegard of Bingen is also known as the Sibyl of the Rhine. She was a nun, a writer, a composer, and a woman who had visions from God. She lived in Germany during the 1100s. People remember her for her strong faith and for using her gifts to serve the Church. Saint Hildegard of Bingen reminds us that God can speak to anyone, even someone who feels

can speak to anyone, even someone who feels small or unsure. She was a quiet girl who saw visions. She did not want to tell anyone at first. She was afraid people would not believe her. But she trusted God more than her fear. In time, she spoke and shared what she saw. She reminds us that we should not hide the gifts God gives us.

Hildegard's life teaches us to listen, to trust, and to act. We may not have visions like she did, but we all have gifts. We all have chances to speak kindly, to help others, and to serve in our own way. God uses all kinds of people. He speaks in ways that we can hear, if we take time to listen.


