

Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

We are faced with strong and disturbing readings today that hold a certain fascination, since they seem at first glance to be blueprints for future inevitable wars and hardship. A fundamentalist interpretation focuses on this aspect. Yet we hear them at our Sunday celebration of the Eucharist, which infuses them with hope and optimism. Rather than dreading the future, today's liturgy assures us that God is with us in all of life's inevitable trials, and that we have a role in shaping the outcome of human history. Occasionally, some Christians have attempted to decode these readings for an exact measure of the world's end, but they have thus far been disappointed.

"Nothing lasts forever" is a lyric from a Broadway show. Stars fall from the sky, leaves wither and fall, mountains wash into the sea, human projects and governments totter and collapse with great regularity. Today's liturgy opposes this idea as incomplete, reminding us that Christ has made a permanent change in human history, and that life in him is life forever. Rather than inviting us to throw in the towel, today's liturgy strengthens us for acts of goodness and grace in our families, communities, and world.


SUNDAY MORNING WOMEN'S FAITH SHARE GROUP





St. Elizabeth of Hungary Feast Day; November 17

Dedication of Honduras Adopt-a-Village

I was fortunate to be able to attend the dedication of our Honduran Adopt-a-Village in Cucuyagua October 6-10, 2025. The new village which was named, Vida Nueva, (New Life) certainly brought new life to 53 families in the second poorest country in the Western Hemisphere. Thank you to all of the St. Mary parishioners who helped monetarily and through your gifts of clothes, toys, and prayers!

On Tuesday afternoon when we arrived at the mountainous plateau and first saw the beautiful green and tan concrete homes, it was overwhelming. I had tears of joy. The last time I was there in March 2024, it was a flat, dirt area. Even better than seeing the red Community Center and the homes, was seeing the children running towards our bus with their smiles and laughter. It took awhile for all of us to descend from the bus as each of us got many hugs. There was a tent set up outside of the Community Center so the folks could sit in the shade. Tom Ricke welcomed all of them and was greeted with smiles and applauses. Tom, Tom Ernstes, Diann Reisman, Paulette Duerstock, Fr. Carlton Beever, Fr. Bob White, mayor Joshua Marsh, Emily Verseman, my husband, David, and I then went into the Center. The Social Worker who works with Cepudo, the in-country partner for FFTP, had bagged up clothes which we had been sent in May via container from Greensburg, matching the sizes to each of the families. Each family came into the Center and drew a number out of a hat. Then, they received a bicycle matching that number. They also received their bags of clothes. When they left the Center, their friends cheered for them. It was better than Christmas!

The next morning was the official dedication. We sat on a stage with the mayor of Cucuyagua and Cepudo president, Linda Coello, and her daughter-in-law, Lill, and a local priest. Emily ran the video and it was then edited and sent to WTRE along with interviews. There was a wonderful plaque inside the Community Center with a picture of Fr. Tom Royer. He was a missionary priest in Illinois and was the priest of a childhood friend of Glenn Tebbe's from Brookville. When Fr. Tom died in December 2023, FFTP was one of his beneficiaries and through Glenn's efforts, was able to donate over \$400,000 to our cause.

The village had a large concrete sign outside of the Community Center made dedicating the village to St. Mary Church and School. It was covered and was unveiled with the ribbon cutting. We were able to tour some of the homes. The families had been living there only 3 months, but had planted flowers, trees, and vegetables. Linda Burton had sewn curtains for the houses and they looked beautiful in their windows.

We were able to visit a medical clinic in Cucuyagua whose equipment looked like it was from the 1960's. We then got to see the city's new medical clinic that is under construction in the downtown square. It is a three-story building with modern private exam rooms. We met the physician and nurses who will be working there. Decatur County Memorial Hospital donated two exam tables which will be used there. The hospital also donated Physical Therapy equipment and assistive devices for the community's needs.

There was a celebration at the town square with music, dancing, and food. The children enjoyed making bracelets, painting pictures, playing soccer, and drawing pictures with crayons. We were able to visit their school which had two grades/classroom. We gave soccer balls, balloons, and candy to them which brought many smiles. Fr. Carlton had Mass in English and Spanish at the church on the square. The Sign of Peace was so joyful as the children went around the whole church and gave hugs to all.

Thank you to Fr. John, St. Mary parishioners, Decatur County, Holy Family Parish in Oldenburg, St. Mary church in Rushville, St. Vincent de Paul and St. Joseph parishes in Shelbyville, pastoral council, stewardship commission, the Food For The Poor committee, Knights of Columbus, Knights of St. John, Daughters of Isabella, Daily News, WTRE, Fr. Carlton, DCMH, local schools, The Branch, and Batesville Tool & Die for working together to make this dream a reality. May God bless you always!
