



St. Carlo Acutis Exhibit

St. Mary's students had a once-in-a-lifetime experience on Thursday, February 12. Students had the chance to learn more about the life and legacy of the modern day saint, Carlo Acutis. We spent 45 minutes in the church looking at pictures and hearing about this amazing young Italian. The students were intrigued to hear that Carlo was from Milan – the same city as the Olympic Games that they were watching at the time.

Students learned that Carlo did not come from a particularly religious family. They were Catholic but rarely attended mass. But at the age of three, Carlo would beg to go see Jesus anytime he saw the spires of the church. He would spend hours kneeling before the Blessed Sacrament because he realized innately that Jesus was present in the host. He spent much of his short life trying to bring others to this realization. His inspiration came from attending a car show with his grandfather. He noticed the signs next to each car telling about all of the details that make it special and he decided that if he could make signs like that about all of the Eucharistic miracles then people could come to see that the Eucharist is truly Jesus. Those were the posters that were throughout the gathering space and large assembly room.

At the end of the presentation each student had the chance to venerate a first class relic of St. Carlo. Those who touched a rosary, Bible or holy card to the relic made their item a third class relic. It was a truly awesome experience to see our students have this opportunity. We are blessed to have had this exhibit in our own church.

Second Sunday of Lent Transfiguration Manifestation


It may seem odd to hear the Gospel of the Transfiguration of Jesus during Lent. Wouldn't it fit better after Easter? After all, the disciples who witnessed it did not tell anyone else about it until after the Resurrection (Matthew 17:9). An answer is found a few verses after our Gospel selection. Jesus tells the disciples that he will suffer (Matthew 17:12). The vision of Jesus' glory shared by Peter, James, and John was meant to help them not to become discouraged by Jesus' death on the cross. The story encourages us during the long season of Lent to be faithful to our prayers, our Lenten sacrifices, and our charity because we have seen a glimpse of the glory that is coming. Some of the details in the Gospel can help us understand.

First, we hear about Jesus' appearance, that "his face shone like the sun" (Matthew 17:2). Just as we can't look directly at the sun, so people thought that if they looked at the face of God they would die. If the disciples didn't believe that Jesus was the Son of God before, they surely did now. For us this can be a reminder that God is with us during this season of Lent, helping our faith to grow.

Next, the three disciples see Moses and Elijah, who were signs that Jesus fulfills the law and the prophets. But when Peter tries to keep them around by offering to set up tents for them, the voice of God interrupts. God tells them that now they should listen to Jesus. The Gospel tells us to keep our eyes on Jesus throughout Lent. Do I grumble about Lent, seeing it as another set of laws to be obeyed? Perhaps I'm forgetting that Lent is not about how much I do for God, but a time to reflect on what God has done for me.

The last line of the Gospel has Jesus admonishing the three not to tell anyone about their vision until after his resurrection. Maybe the disciples were tempted to brag that they were better than the other followers of Jesus. This reminds us that the sacrifices of Lent don't just make us look holy; they lead us to the new life of Easter.


