Divine Mercy Sunday

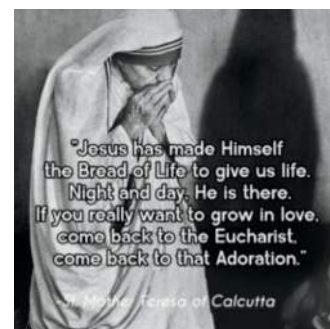
Sunday, April 12 | 3:00 pm

Notice from the Cemetery

Please be advised that the mowing season is near and any objects not in accordance with cemetery rules and regulations need to be removed as soon as possible. This includes any object (statue, bench, plaque) resting on the grass. A shepherd's hook is permitted. Flowers, trees, and shrubbery may not be planted around the headstone or on the grave. Cut flowers and other decorations may be placed on the graves up to a limit of four bouquets. However, from April 1st to October 30th of each year, flowers and decorations must remain on the headstones or a shepherd's hook. We will start seeding the ground on the newly buried when the dirt has settled and weather permits.

Please help keep our cemetery a tranquil and clean place for all to visit and pray.

Happy Easter!

Happy Easter! He is alive! We should feel unparalleled joy today because today is the day that Christ triumphed over evil. Easter is only possible because of Good Friday. And every year on that day, I can't help but think of the hymn "Were You There When They Crucified My Lord?" In addition to asking "Were you there when they crucified my Lord?" subsequent verses ask "Were you there when they nailed Him to the tree?" "Were you there when the sun refused to shine?" and "Were you there when they laid Him in the tomb?" Every year, in the parish I grew up in, we would sing this song, and every year it made me cry, for it forced me to really visualize Christ's crucifixion. After each question, the song laments: "Sometimes it causes me to tremble."

Christ died a horrible and violent death for me. He died a horrible and violent death for you.

No, we were not physically present there. But we were there in that very person who had existed and who would ever exist in Christ's mind during every second of His Passion. So, yes, we were there, because we are the reason that He allowed Himself to be tortured and killed.

There has never been a love so immense as the love God has for us. He proved that love on Good Friday so that we could have an Easter Sunday. What a gift! The blood He shed for our sins opened eternity with Him for us. So yes, we should tremble. We should tremble at the innocent blood that was spilled on Good Friday.

But we should also tremble with joy—at the empty tomb, at the promise fulfilled, and at the mercy of an all-loving and all-powerful God.

The two individuals on the road to Emmaus met Christ after the Resurrection, but they didn't recognize Him right away. It was only when He broke the bread and gave a blessing that they realized it was He. Sometimes we are like those men. We don't recognize Christ in our lives, or we are so focused on our own lives that we just don't see Him. But when we hear His words, our hearts burn, too. Lent is over, but our journey to heaven is never ending.

So as we think about Christ's sacrifice today and as we sing joyful hymns and praise God for the gift of Himself, let us promise Him that we will work every day to not only achieve eternity with Him but to help others get there as well. Our faith demands that we evangelize. Let us begin by shouting our joy that He has risen.

And let us rejoice, for today we celebrate our salvation!

"New Life Community" Cucuyagua, Honduras Update/ Bicycles Needed

Bicycle Donation Dates: Weekends of May 9 & 10 and May 16 & 17

St. Mary Church (Back Parking Lot)

We continue to take care of and nourish the poorest of poor in Honduras through our "New Life Community." We are currently in Phase II of the building mission. This phase will provide much needed water, food, electricity, sewage, and more housing to the community of Cucuyagua. In this phase, 53 additional houses will be built totaling 103 houses built! For this purpose, we are asking for your help to provide bicycles and mountain bikes of all sizes, safety helmets, and bicycle parts. The bicycles you are able to give will be a wonderful blessing to the Cucuyagua people. It will allow them to be able to ride to and from school or work everyday, rather than just walking. The bicycles provided will make it possible for individuals to cover a larger area more efficiently, allowing access to more jobs and the ability to better support their families.

Batesville Tool and Die is providing a semi trailer in the back parking lot of St. Mary Church during the weekends of May 9 & 10 and May 16 & 17 after all Masses to accept donations of bicycles, bicycle parts, and safety helmets. Any extra bicycles will go to neighbors who are in dire need.

We are grateful for the support of Batesville Tool & Die. We would also like to recognize Margaret Mary Hospital, Batesville for their donation of hospital beds and medical equipment. As well as, St. Vincent de Paul, Indianapolis for donating a skid of new T-Shirts and 60 bicycles for this cause.

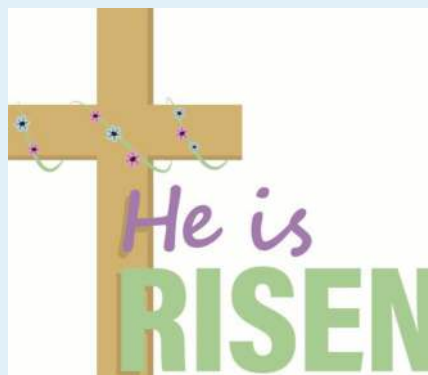

Resurrection Rolls

A recipe to tell the Story of Easter

- 1 (8 ounce) package refrigerated crescent rolls
- 1/4 cup of sugar
- 1 tablespoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 cup butter, melted
- 8 large marshmallows
- Parchment Paper

1. Place parchment paper on a baking sheet. Preheat the oven according to the directions on the crescent roll packaging. **Read John 19 about the crucifixion of Jesus while the oven warms up.**
2. **The pure white marshmallow represents Jesus Christ, who is pure white because he never did anything wrong. He was free from all sin, yet died for our sins because He loves us.**
3. **His friends used oils and spices on His body to prepare it to be buried.** Roll the marshmallow in melted butter, which is like the embalming oils. Then, roll the marshmallow in the cinnamon & sugar, which represents the burial spices.
4. **Then, Jesus’ friends wrapped His body in a clean cloth.** Unroll the crescent roll dough and separate into sections. Wrap the marshmallow inside one section of dough. Pinch sides closed. Repeat with each marshmallow.
5. **Jesus’ body was placed in a tomb.** Put the rolls on the prepared baking sheet and place them in the oven, which represents the tomb, and bake as directed on the crescent roll package.
6. **Read John 20:1-18 about the Jesus’ resurrection** while the rolls bake.
7. **On the third day, the tomb was empty. Jesus was resurrected!** After the rolls are baked and cooled, cut them open to reveal the marshmallow is gone.

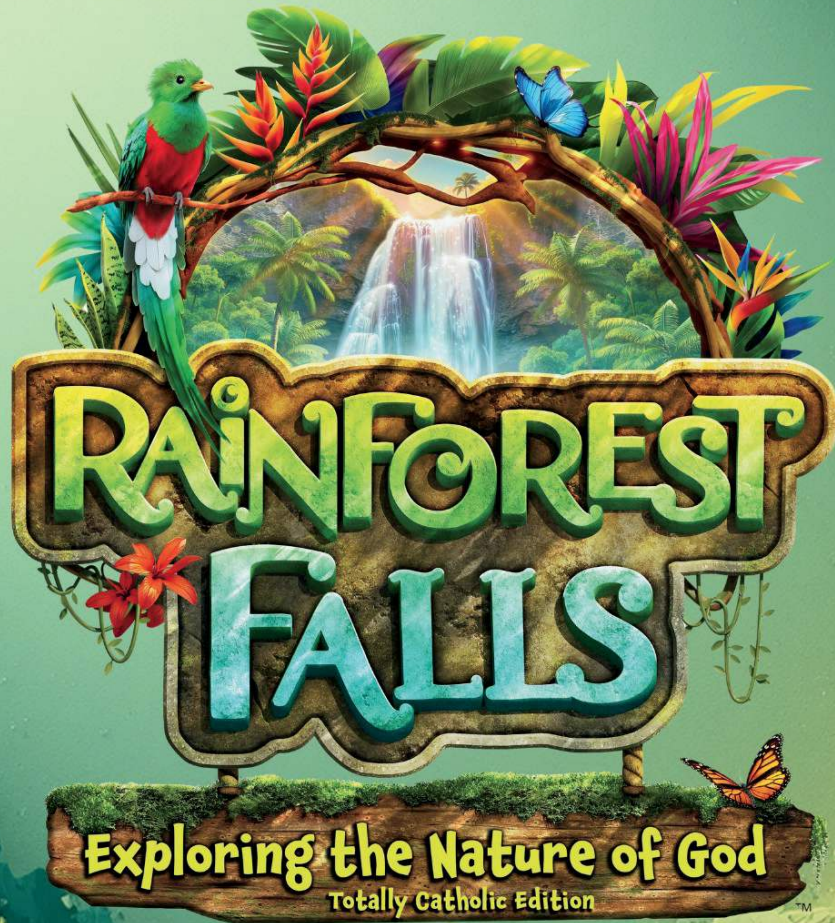
Now on the first day of the week Mary Magdalene came early to the tomb, while it was still dark, and saw the stone already removed from the tomb. Jn 20:1
